### Bearcats go 0-1-1 for week

For the first time this season, Binghamton (6-5-1, 0-2-1) went winless during the week, recording a loss at Northeastern on Thursday and a scoreless draw with New Hampshire back home on Sunday.

### Tie gives BU point in America East standings

The point against a New Hampshire team that is expected to be a contender was important, though head coach Jeff Leightman certainly was looking for a win and the three points that accompany it.

"We had a lot of chances that were right there," Leightman said. "I thought we played really well, but somehow the ball just stayed out. We'll take a point."

The Bearcats have now played three of the top five teams in the conference. Of the team's six remaining games, three are against teams that were picked to finish below Binghamton in the pre-season coaches poll.

### Freshmen Doerner pressed into action between pipes

Freshman keeper **Kristy Doerner (Shoreham, N.Y./Shoreham-Wading River)** made her collegiate debut early in the game at Northeastern, after classmate and starter **Kristie Bowers (Rochester, N.Y./Greece Olympia)** had to leave the game with an ankle injury. Then in her first collegiate start on Sunday, Doerner recorded six saves in 110 minutes to earn her first career shutout.

"I'm very happy with Kristy's play," Leightman said. "It was a pressure-filled spot, and she looked very steady and very poised. She responded well. We also played well in front of her."

### Goals hard to come by for BU offense

The offensive struggles continued last week, as the Bearcats played 200 minutes of soccer without scoring a goal. Binghamton is averaging 1.39 goals per game this season, and has been held to one goal or less in six of the team's last seven games (2-3-1). It has been particularly difficult for BU to find the net against conference opponents. Dating back to last season, the team has scored just four goals in its last 10 games against America East foes.

### Up Next: Stony Brook

The Bearcats have just one game this week — an America East match against SUNY rival Stony Brook. The Seawolves, who were picked to finish fourth in the pre-season poll, are 1-1 in conference play. They lost at Northeastern (5-1) and pulled out a 1-0 overtime win over an Albany team that is 1-10-1. Last year, Stony Brook defeated Binghamton 2-0 on Long Island.
