### Bearcats win second straight America East game

Binghamton took to the road and scored a big 2-0 win at UMBC — the team's second consecutive road win in conference play. In three seasons of America East play, it is the first time the women have won twice on the road, and it also is the first time BU has won two straight conference games, though the 2002 team had a three-game unbeaten streak. Now having played three teams that were picked to finish ahead of Binghamton in the pre-season coaches' poll, the Bearcats are 2-1 and hold a share of third place with six points.

### Povill's offensive numbers rank high in conference

Freshman forward **Kim Povill (Massapequa, N.Y./Massapequa)** scored both goals against UMBC — her second multi-goal game this fall. Povill now has 19 points in her first 12 collegiate games and ranks first in the America East in assists, third in points and seventh in goals per game.

### Loss to No. 19 West Virginia ends non-conference slate

With Binghamton's home defeat to No. 19 West Virginia, the Bearcats have concluded their non-conference slate for the 2004 season. The team went 6-2-1 in those games, and are now 18-8-2 out of conference since 2002. Binghamton's remaining six regular-season games are all against America East opponents.

### O'Shaughnessy continues string of assists

Senior center midfielder **Caitlin O'Shaughnessy (Stony Point, N.Y./North Rockland)** notched an assist against UMBC — her fourth in the last six games.

### Offense showing improvement against AE foes

With the team's 2-0 win over UMBC, BU has now scored five goals in its first three conference games — a vast improvement over last season. Against New Hampshire, Maine and UMBC in 2003, the Bearcats only scored one goal and went 0-1-2. Now just three games into the nine-game slate, BU has six points in the standings — already more than halfway to last season's 11-point total — a total that fell just shy of advancing Binghamton to the conference tournament.

### Bearcats hold down No. 10 in regional rankings

Binghamton held its spot at No. 10 in this week's NSCAA Northeast poll. Boston College is No. 1, followed by UConn, Boston University, Hofstra, Harvard, Yale, St. John's, Maine, Northeastern and Binghamton. The Bearcats defeated Maine 1-0 one week ago.

### Up Next: Albany and Stony Brook

The Bearcats entertain fellow SUNY Centers Albany and Stony Brook this weekend. Binghamton is 12-0-1 all-time against the Great Danes and 2-2 against the Seawolves. Last season, BU beat Albany 3-0 and edged Stony Brook 1-0.
